

College Tips

Why do differences matter?

The SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) and ACT (American College Testing) are aptitude tests used by colleges and universities to aid in admissions decisions. Students may choose to take the SAT, ACT, or both. However, it is usually more efficient to focus your studying efforts on one test. Choosing between the SAT and ACT may seem difficult, but we have compiled differences and similarities to help your decision!

The greatest difference between the tests is that the ACT includes a section for Science. However, this section tests your analytical skills rather than specific knowledge of science. Another difference is that the SAT provides math formulas for calculations whereas the ACT doesn't. Additionally, SAT math has a grid-in section for students to input their answers whereas the ACT math is all multiple choice.




